SYSTRA WIN A76 Corridor Partnership Study

This study will involve a technical analysis and review of existing multi-modal transport links on the A76 Corridor between Kilmarnock and Dumfries.



The A76 provides an essential corridor for passenger and freight transport between central and southern Scotland. East Ayrshire and Dumfries and Galloway councils have demonstrated a commitment to working together through the A76 Transport Corridor Partnership due to the strategic importance of this corridor and its role in serving both local authorities. This analysis will be used to create an evidence based plan for an economically and environmentally sustainable future of the A76.
